



**ATTACHMENT 1 - Art. 5 – EVALUATION OF QUALIFICATIONS
SELECTION PROCEDURES FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF RANKINGS FOR THE
ASSIGNMENT OF GRANTS FOR TUTORING ACTIVITIES – ACADEMIC YEAR 2023/2024**

Qualifications possessed at the time of the deadline of the procedure will be evaluated.

The evaluation of qualifications will consider the university career: students who are enrolled in a higher level course will be assigned a higher score (PhD, Master's Degree, Single-Cycle Master's Degree, Bachelor's Degree) and, among these, students enrolled in the highest year, based on merit and on the following formula:

→ For enrolled in PhD and Master's Degrees: $P \cdot 5 \cdot (1 - V/V_{\max})$

Where **P** stands for the maximum points ascribable to qualifications, in relation to course and year of enrolment (table), **V** is the degree mark; **V_{max}** is the maximum degree mark achievable;

→ For enrolled in Single-Cycle Degrees and Bachelor's Degrees: $P \cdot 5 \cdot (1 - C/C_{\max})$

Where **P** stands for the maximum points ascribable to qualifications, in relation to course and year of enrolment (table), **C** are the credits achieved at the time of the deadline of the procedure, **C_{max}** are the maximum credits achievable during the academic career in which students are enrolled (up to a.y. 2023/2024).

Successively, it will also be evaluated the weighted average of the marks of the exams carried out at the time of the deadline of the procedure.

The maximum point **P** ascribable to qualifications is the following:
