Application Information

If you want to study as Erasmus student at Universidad Europea del Atlántico, you should first contact the Erasmus coordinator at your home university and ask to be nominated for a short study period. Your nomination should be sent by your Erasmus coordinator to our Erasmus Office e-mail: laura.martin@uneatlantico.es

After receiving an official nomination, we will contact the students and provide all information about the application process.

The nominated students will be required to send the following documents:

- A photocopy of the applicant's passport or ID
- One digital passport-size photograph
- Home Address and phone number

Once we have checked your application documents you will receive a Letter of Acceptance.

Useful Information

Visa

Non-EU Citizens

Non-EU citizens need to apply for a visa before their arrival in Spain.

A detailed information on other requirements to obtain a student visa may be found on the official website of the embassy of Spain in your country of residence or on the official website of Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Spain.

On arrival in Santander, students will need to validate their visa at the foreigners office located in the city centre.

Health Insurance

Please note that if you are a member of the European Union you do not need to have a private health insurance since you are covered with your (EHIC) European Health Insurance Card. With this card you will receive any necessary medically-related health care benefits during your temporary stay in the territory of the European Economic Area or Switzerland, taking into account the type of the benefits and the duration of the stay, in accordance with the law of the relevant country, regardless of whether the purpose of the stay is a holiday, a professional activity or for studying.

If you are not a member of the European Union you will have to ask if there is any kind of agreement between the Social Security in your country and the Spanish one. If not, you will need to have a private health insurance.

Housing

It is the responsibility of the incoming student to arrange their own housing, whether on-campus or otherwise. Uneatlantico will assist exchange students with on-campus housing requests.

The students' residence is located in the Scientific and Technological Park of Cantabria, just two hundred meters away from the campus, five hundred meters from a shopping mall and very well connected with downtown Santander. A bus line with a stop in the same street connects all these points fast and effectively, since the line frequency is high.

The residence counts with avant-garde facilities, which are comfortable, functional and designed with criteria for energy efficiency to meet the accommodation needs of professors, researchers and students.

When applying you will be required to pay a refundable deposit and all residents will have included the following services: Water, electricity and gas supplies, heating and Wi-Fi. Sheets are changed once a week. Cleaning of the room on a monthly basis.
