Temporary stay permit	 Within 48 hours from students' arrival, the landlord (owner of the apartment where the student lives) has to register students' residence in Croatia. This is done through e-visitor system. Process of issuing the First Temporary Stay Permit: Application for issuance of Approval for temporary stay – form 1b (EU citizens), form 1a (non-EU citizens) – the forms will be given to you at the OW Passport and a copy of the passport; Invitation letter from the UNIDU stating the study purpose of your stay (Acceptance letter/Prihvatno pismo) Proof of sufficient means of subsistence (statement of bank account, scholarship confirmation or similar) - translated into Croatian; - FOR ERASMUS STUDENTS: home university has to issue a statement in English confirming that the student receives the scholarship – this statement is later translated by UNIDU International Office into Croatian language European Health Card and a copy of the card or any other Health Card Insurance Card; Copy of your "Confirmation of registration" – given to students by their landlords; A small photo (35x45 mm) – only for NON-EU students Non-criminal Record confirmation – only for NON-EU students
